In order to maintain academic integrity and consistency across all classrooms, the following are exam expectations:

- Attendance is expected from all students. Any absences must have prior approval by the Head of School. *Students who are unexcused from their exams receive a grade of F for the exam.*
- **All students must take the exam at the scheduled time unless they have prior approval from the Head of School.**
- **Cell phones are not allowed in the test room during the entire exam period.** Students should not bring them to the exam room.
- **Book bags and purses are not allowed in the test room for the entire exam period.** Students should leave these items in their lockers, dorm rooms or outside of the classroom.
- **Food and drinks are not allowed during the entire exam period.** Students may bring WATER ONLY to class, no fruit juices, coffee, etc. Only hard candy is allowed for IB exams.
- Once the exam starts, students are not permitted to leave the exam room for the first hour of testing, unless it is an emergency. Students are not allowed to roam or loiter across campus during the exam period. **Students must have a “Testing Pass” from an instructor if permitted to leave the room after the first hour.**
- Students are encouraged to take advantage of the full exam period. **The exam room must remain quiet until all students have completed their exam.** Students are encouraged to bring a book to read so as to have something to do if they finish early.
- **All students are to uphold Navajo Preparatory School’s policy on academic honesty, cheating, and plagiarism.** Students need to be aware of policy violation and consequences.
