CODE OF CONDUCT:

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Navajo Preparatory School Ambassadors are highly respected representatives and are hereby to uphold the following responsibilities:

- 1. Ambassadors must provide all traditional attire and jewelry at their own expense and its safekeeping.
- 2. Ambassadors are to dress in their traditional attire <u>each Wednesday</u> during their reign and during cultural events held by the school.
- 3. Ambassadors will coordinate with Hózhó Naashá Pageant Sponsor in participating as an NPS representative at schools and community culture events/activities.
- 4. Ambassadors are to refrain from the use of alcohol, drugs, smoking, pofane language, and unacceptable socializing with peers in public.
- 5. Miss Hózhó Naashá is responsible for the care and safekeeping of the crown and sash during her reign.
- 6. Mr. Atsá Hastíín is responsible for the care and safekeeping of the bow guard and satchel during his reign.
- 7. Ayáásh Ambassador is responsible for the care and safekeeping of the Navajo Prep medallion and sash during their reign.
- 8. All reigning ambassadors are responsible for obtaining the appropriate robe or shawl to give as a gift to the next ambassador.
